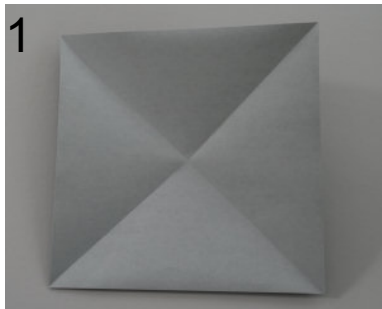


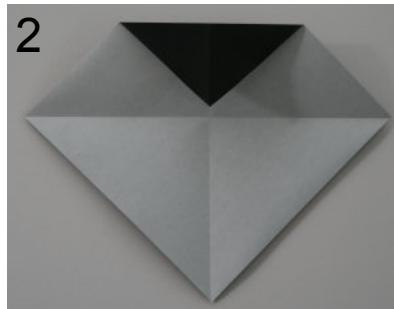
Origami Cat - Part 1

This gorgeous cat could be flying on a broomstick for Halloween, or proudly displayed on a birthday card for a cat-loving Grandma! Relatively easy to fold, you should make sure that you crease everything very well.

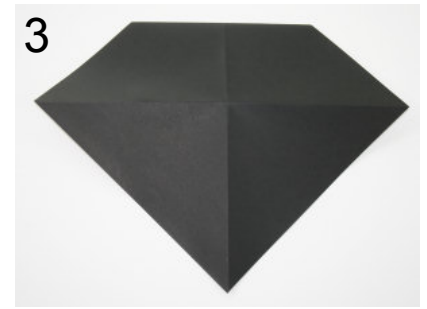
The cat's body comes in part 2.



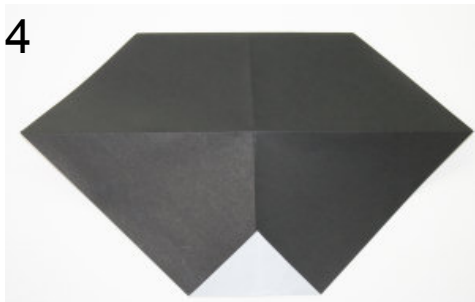
1 With coloured side down, fold your square in half on both the diagonals, and open out again.



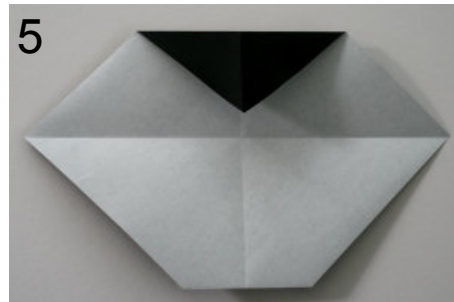
2 Fold the top corner down to the middle, and crease well.



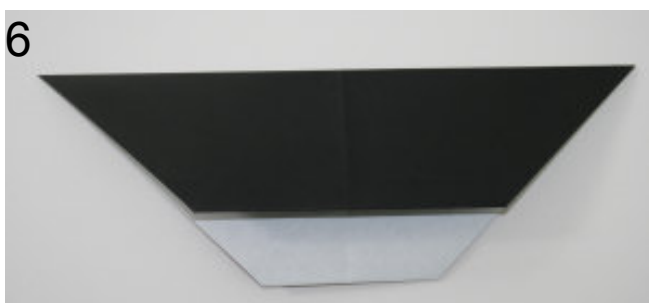
3 Flip over.



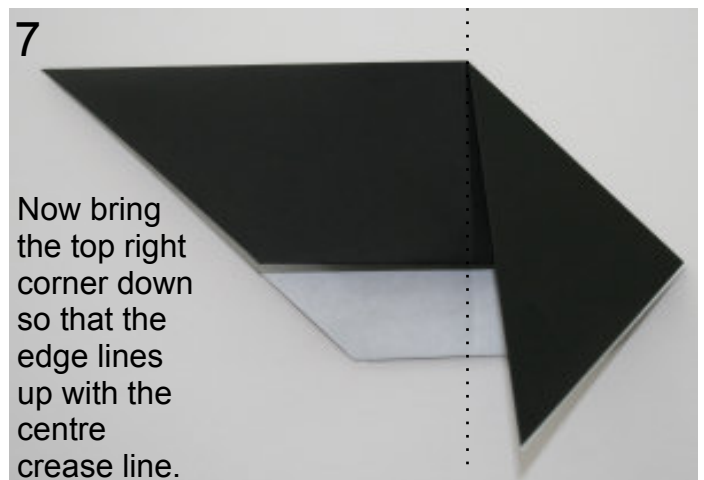
4 Now fold the bottom corner up as shown.



5 Flip over again.

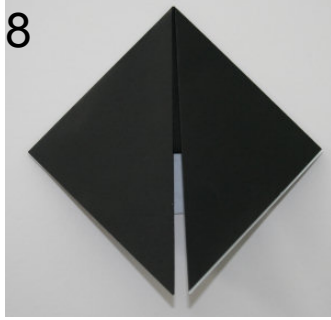


6 Fold the top half of the model down on the original crease line.

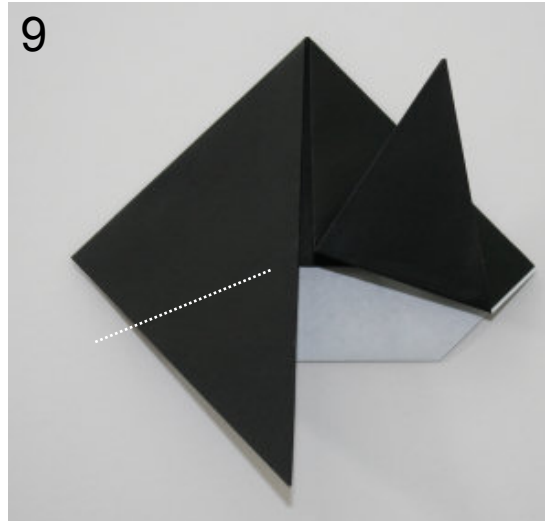


7 Now bring the top right corner down so that the edge lines up with the centre crease line.

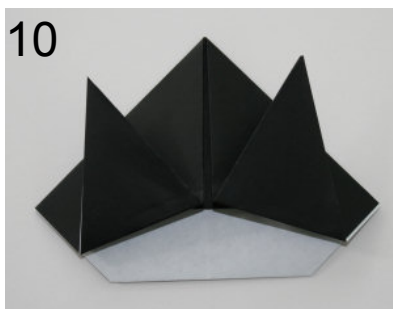

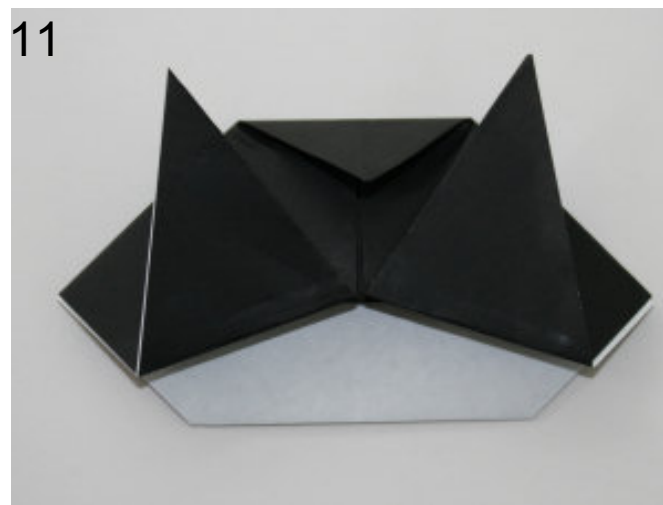
Do the same for the top left corner.



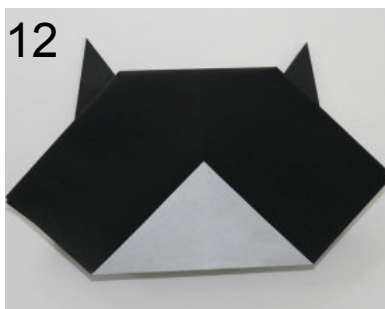
Now fold the two flaps up carefully to form the cat's ears. Look at the dotted line on the photo to see where the fold should go.



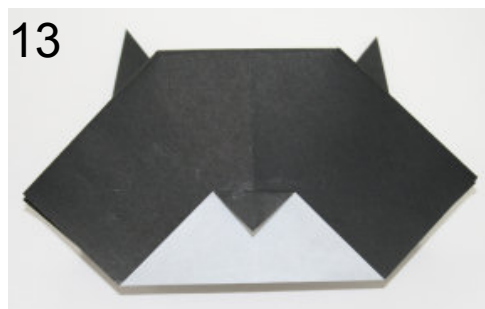
When you have folded up both flaps, your model should look like this.



Bring the top point down between the ears to form the top of your cat's head.



Flip over.



Turn down the nose and decorate your cat's face!
