

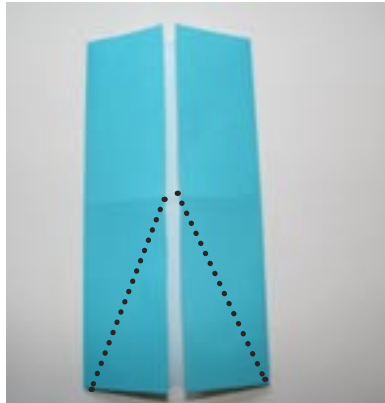
Origami Blouse

Here is a girl's version of the traditional origami shirt model. Make it in plain paper and add your own decorations, or choose pretty flowery origami paper to make a very girly shirt!

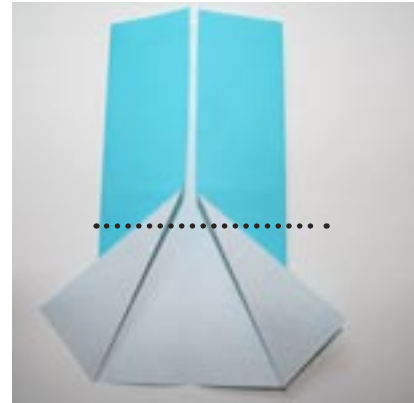
Make one for all your friends with their name on the front! Use them for invitations, birthday cards, or name tags.



1. Start with your square face down. Fold in half horizontally and vertically, to crease, as shown.



2. Bring the sides into the centre. Fold the flaps out along the dotted lines, as shown....



3. ...so that your model looks like this. Now fold the bottom up towards the top along the dotted line, and crease well.

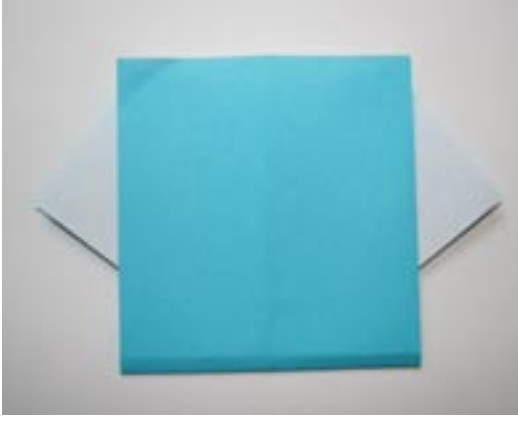


4. Your blouse is beginning to take shape! Form the collar by turning the top flaps down along the dotted lines.



5. Like so. Nearly there!

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6. Flip over.



7. Make tiny little triangular folds on the top corners to shape the blouse.



8. And you are done!
