
Origami Elf


This funny little elf could be busy at Christmas helping Santa Claus, or causing trouble for St Patrick's Day!

Once you've folded the model you can have fun adding facial features with pens and crayons, or by sticking on wiggly eyes as we have done.






With your paper colour side down, fold in half diagonally.



Bring the corners down and into the middle crease, being careful to keep a nice point at the top.




Lift up the flaps from the bottom and fold out so that they meet the edges, as shown.




Uncrease.


Origami Elf - page 2



Again lift the flaps, this time folding the corners up to meet the crease you have just made...




...and fold back up again along the original creases.




Fold the top point down to the bottom corner and crease well.



Fold back up again as shown. Make sure you crease well to keep the hat in place.



Flip over, and fold the bottom corner up.




Fold the two outside corners into the middle and crease carefully.



Fold the top point down to the middle, too.



Lift the point that you have just folded back up again, folding it slightly at an jaunty angle!



Shape the elf's chin by folding up the bottom corners at an angle, as shown.



Flip over, and your elf is ready to decorate!
