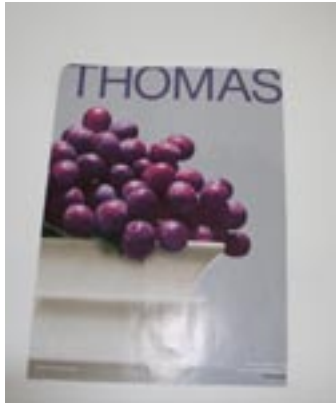


Origami Magazine Box

A page torn from an old glossy magazine is the perfect size for this easy origami box - and if you choose the page carefully you can come up with some very interesting and pretty designs while recycling at the same time!

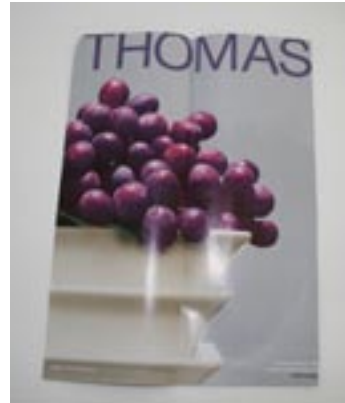
The side of the paper you want on the inside of the box should be facing up when you start folding.



1. Take a single page out of an old magazine.



2. Fold in half lengthways.



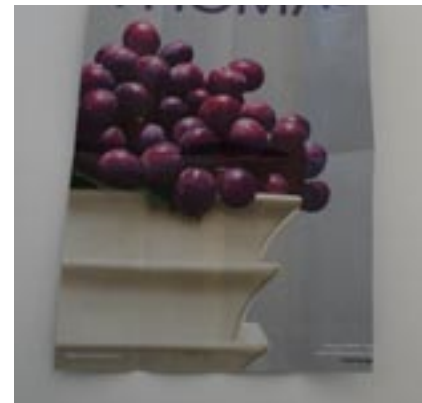
3. Unfold.



4. Bring the edges in to meet the centre fold you have just made.



5. Open out again.



6. Fold in half horizontally, crease, and open out once more.



7. Bring the edges in to meet the horizontal fold you have just made, and crease.

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8. Fold the corners in, as shown. Look at the photo above - they should not quite meet the centre line.



9. Bring the top layer at the centre line out and over the triangular folds you have just made. Crease very firmly.



10. Carefully open the box out and ease it into position.
