




Origami Pilgrim Bonnet


This cute little pilgrim bonnet is a little fiddly to fold, but not too difficult - and it is just the right size for a doll! You will need two small pieces of ribbon or cord to tie it.

If you used a very large square of black paper, you could make a large enough bonnet for a child to wear!




With coloured side down, fold your square in half along the straight edges and diagonals.


Now form the water-bomb base by folding the shape in, as shown in the photos above.



Fold the top left and right corners up to the top corner, as shown.



Now fold the flaps in to meet at the centre...



Your model should look like this. Now fold the two top flaps down along the dotted line..



.. and crease along the diagonal dotted lines.




Now tuck those little flaps inside the pockets made by the triangles marked on the photo, and crease well to keep them secure.



Fold the top corner down.



Flip over, and fold the crease the bottom edge of the triangle up to begin to form the brim of the bonnet. (you will not be able to fold it up all the way)



Open the bonnet out, shaping it with your fingers as you go. Carefully release the edges of the brim and crease them, too.



Attach two short lengths of ribbon or cord to the front of the bonnet, and it is ready to wear!
